

PCCW meeting minutes

11/16/23

Meeting called to order at 7:00pm by the president, Jean Felber

Opening prayer (led by Fr. Felix): Prayer to Our Lady of Good Counsel

Pastor's message: encouraging words were received on the Women's Day event and Father would love to see these type of events to continue.

June 7th (the Friday after the Feast of Corpus Christie) there is a Eucharistic procession starting in various places and will meet and join together. Near us, one begins at the mouth of the Mississippi river and cross our diocese and go to Green Bay. There are several events that go along with this processional. A discussion has started on organizing transportation to join the processional. The 4 starting points meet in Indianapolis for a 5-day conference. Tickets are now available.

Renovation update: River Valley Architects has been in contact with a group from our parish on the design of All Saints Hall. The contract has been approved by the diocese and the architects will begin measuring and planning next week.

Contracts have been approved for the Boyd renovation and bids are out with the hopes of starting renovation in the spring.

1. Treasure Report: Ann

Balance after all income and expenses from Christmas raffle and Pork Dinner in Cadott=\$9751.99 (as of Nov. 22nd)

Upcoming expenses: Christmas gifts and PCCW Christmas party

2. Circle Reports:

- St Joseph: Pam Dorn: Not much activity since last meeting. Brought to the council's attention that cross memorials were put on cemetery plots for priests in our parish cemeteries. It was decided to get a total in our 5 cemeteries and decide on the purchase in March.

It was brought to the attention of the council that there was a concern about Christmas decorations needing a budget: a motion was made by Jenn Rogalski to allow up to \$100 available per church for Christmas decorations. Seconded by Julia. Motion carried.

- Holy Family: Ann Wagner: There was a large wedding that was successful. There is a craft show in Stanley on the 18th and setup is planned for Friday (the day before). There are 15 vendors (3 more than last year). There's a small lunch. There will be a book sale at the craft show as well. The quilt raffle is the day of the craft show.
 - St. Rose of Lima: Lorrie Sonnentag: Pork and sauerkraut dinner had 180 adults and 7 children attending, with a total profit \$1464.76 from the dinner, \$248.00 from the bake sale, and \$251 silent auction with a total of \$1963.76 profit. 35 people volunteered over the course of the event with special thanks to Barb for putting in an exceptional amount of time and work into the dinner. A special thanks to Anita Boos for slicing all the pies. Another special thanks to Hanson's in Stanley for giving a very special deal on pies since there was a major shortage of pies for the dinner. All leftovers were frozen and brought to Sojourner House and St. Joseph School lunch program.
3. Update on Raffle—Diane Weggen (not able to attend) 500 tickets were sold at \$20 each. 3 people did the drawing. \$10,000 income, \$5138.82 expenses with a profit of \$4861.82 (one \$50 winner donated it back)
 4. Update on Pork dinner October 22 – Lorrie (see St. Rose report above)
 5. Christmas Gifts-determine amount for gifts.
 Father: motioned to give \$400 by Marilyn Bowe seconded by Pam Dorn, approved
 Deacon: motioned to give \$400 by Lori Setzer seconded by Loraine Seichter, approved
 \$30 per teacher (16 teachers)
 6. Christmas Party at 6:30 December 14-Pam and Barb organizing games and prizes with a budget of \$65. Stanley group is asked to decorate.
 Encouragement was given to invite all the parish women.

New Business:

1. PCCW Survey-Jenn Rogalski asked to drop any final survey forms into the collection box at the meeting.
2. Possible "Woman's Day" in spring. Suggested to have a smaller social event in the spring and then focus on a larger push for the Eucharistic revival.

3. A discussion was had about PCCW dues...Do we need them? It was decided to table the discussion until the spring.
4. Christmas cheer baskets for the homebound: December 9th at St. Joseph in Boyd at 9am. Asking to bring cookies, fruit, and goodies to fill the baskets. Asking for help to deliver them after they are put together. About 100 baskets are put together.
