

All Saints PCCW Agenda

Thursday, March 20, 2025, 7PM Cadott

Meeting called to order at 7:10pm

Opening Prayer: Prayer to Our Lady of Good Counsel--Jean

Pastor's Message: Fr. Felix was unable to attend. Prayers given for Fr. Felix's health and wellbeing.

Old Business:

1. Treasure Report: Ann Wagner

- Pre-Authorization is required for Purchases. These need to be presented for approval at general meeting.
- Check requests must be presented to Ann with appropriate receipts.
Balance= \$11,182.92 as of the date of the meeting.

2. Circle Reports:

Ann Wagner: asking the Stanley group what to do with the remaining funds in the previous Holy Family PCCW account.

Ann made a motion as representative of the old Stanley PCCW to roll remaining funds into the general fund \$3165 with consideration of pending expenses of bases being built for statues at the altar. Seconded by Diane Weggen. Passed

Lorrie Sonnentag: gave report on progress of the spring Pork dinner at St. Rose. She mentioned that rather than having strictly pies for the dinner, it was advertised as "desert" to be able to get donations of a variety of deserts. There will be a drive up/carry out option for guests. Kim Gundlach was recruited to get teenager volunteers. Reported that there will be a cleaning day on Sat. 3/22/25. Reported that the dishwasher at St. Rose needs repair.

Pam: No report

3. Funeral/Events/Bingo update Jenn Rogalski:

*Funerals: asking for group leader volunteers

*Events: One event was held at the hall for WB (Wisconsin Bench). They were very pleased with having the event at the hall.

*Bingo: There are a couple groups of volunteers for setup, baking/cooking, and serving. It's going well and we can always use more volunteers. Bingo concessions brought in about \$1500 in February. March, so far brought in about \$2000. February had a lot of start up costs but showed a profit. It was clarified that no start-up funds for bingo came

from PCCW. After bingo is over in the spring, 50% of profits will go to the hall, 25% to PCCW, and 25% to Knights of Columbus.

4. Mother's Day Raffle—Diane Weggen

Diane provided light blue tickets for the raffle to distribute to PCCW members. The raffle is being run exactly like the Christmas cash raffle done in the past. 500 tickets being sold for all-cash prizes. Drawing 50 winners will be held on May 10th, at 5:10pm, at All Saints Parish Hall

5. Wreaths for Priests buried in the parish: there are 13. Lorrie Sonnentag will place them for Cadott, Ann Licht will place them for Boyd/Edson, and Julie Lingen will place them for Stanley at the graves for Memorial Day.

New Business:

1. Easter Bingo—Jenn Rogalski

Free bingo for families to win Easter dinner (turkeys, stuffing, potatoes, vegetables and cranberry sauce) 25 winners of a grocery bag of food. There will be prizes for teenagers as well. The time of the event will be between meals so popcorn and lemonade will be served. The event will be held on Sunday April 6th (one week before Palm Sunday)

2. Popcorn Maker for Corn feed , Boyd Festival this summer—Jenn Rogalski asked the PCCW if we'd like to have a popcorn stand to sell popcorn at the event. It was agreed upon to move forward with participating in the event.

3. Exec council emergency expense:

A motion was made by Diane Weggen to give the Executive Council the ability to spend up to, but no more than \$500 at one time with a maximum of \$1000 per budget year, without full membership approval in urgent situations pending approval from all executive board members. Seconded by Pam Dorn. Passed

4. Gifts for First Communion-Jean Falber: Cost for 1st Communion gifts was approx. \$200

5. Floor Scrubber for Hall—Tina Williams spoke on the recommended floor scrubber for the hall would cost approx. \$10,000 for the type of floor at the hall. Doing the math on the cost of the scrubber plus the cost of someone running it, it would cost less to hire the floor cleaned than purchasing a scrubber. It is undetermined of who will be cleaning the parish properties at this time and more information is needed before making any decision on a contribution to a floor scrubber.

6. Annual Budget development: An estimated annual budget was compiled by the executive committee and presented to the full council.

7. Easter Gifts for Father and Deacon: It was suggested to change the “Easter Gifts” to an “end of the year” gift. The PCCW will evaluate funding at the end of the fiscal year (June 30th) to offer a gift to the parish. It was decided that there will not be a gift in honor of Father and Deacon this Easter.
8. Julie Lingen spoke about the wall that was built in the hall kitchen that needed to be painted immediately because the state inspector was scheduled to visit to approve the kitchen use. She painted the wall on her own time and provided the primer. A motion was made by Diane Weggen to reimburse Julie for the cost of the primer for painting the wall. Janet Wojcik seconded the motion. Motion Passed.
