

All Saints PCCW Agenda

Called to order at 7:00pm

Opening Prayer: Hail Mary

Pastor's Message: Fr. Felix (unable to attend): He asked to report back to him on what we accomplish at the meeting.

Old Business:

1. Treasure Report: Ann Wagner Balance=\$16,369.99
2. Circle Reports:
 - Pam Dorn: Raffle tickets aren't selling as well as in the past. About 90 remaining
 - Ann Wagner: Nothing to report
 - Lorrie Sonnentag: 90 tickets left
3. Funeral/Events/Bingo update Jenn Rogalski: We've made \$1300 from funerals since Jan. 1st, One wedding on July 19th coming up and Sportsman's banquet in September. We get \$300 for each event. Bingo concessions have been going well. All good comments on the concessions have been coming in. If anyone wants to help but haven't been called, feel free to reach out to Jenn with updated phone numbers. It was requested to have a signup sheet in the back of churches for volunteers and baked goods. Easter bingo (free event) had almost 100 people attend. It went really good. The event expenses were split between the Knights and PCCW. The PCCW paid \$368.47 and the Knights paid the other half.
4. Mother's Day Raffle—Diane Weggen There are too many tickets left to sell (over 250). There needs to be a big push to sell them in the next 2 weeks. Requested to make announcements at bingo and after Mass. The cash prizes must be paid regardless of the amount of income from the ticket sales.
5. Pork Dinner—Lorrie Sonnentag/Barb Peterson: Income \$3685.00 Expenses \$1239.63 Profit=\$2445.37 Served 171 adults 7 children There was a discussion about continuing the pork dinner in the spring or changing it back to the fall as in the past.
6. Floor Scrubber: The building and grounds committee made the decision that the parish will buy a floor scrubber. They will be buying the M-series which has an upgraded battery, it's maintenance free, "it basically drives itself", and it has a 26" base. The scrubber with an extra 2 cases of pads came to \$7931.00 and the PCCW was asked to consider purchasing the scrubber for the hall. Diane Weggen made a motion to give the

parish \$7931 to purchase the floor scrubber for the parish hall. Seconded by Barb Peterson. Motion carried unanimously.

New Business:

1. Tables and chairs for the school were purchased and the principal, Russ Jenssen requested \$800 to cover some of the cost. Knights of Columbus donated \$800. With \$1600 covered, they are paid for. They were purchased at a significant discount, and they are very happy with them. A motion was made by Barb Peterson for the PCCW to donate \$800 to pay for the remaining cost of the tables and chairs, seconded by Julie Lingen, motion carried unanimously.
2. Parish Photo Directory—Jean Felber, Jen Rogalski, and Char Zenner will be meeting with the photographer and organizing a parish directory July29-Aug 2 and Aug 5-Aug 9
3. Mercy Sunday (April 27) collection— This donation goes to the Diocesan level of the PCCW
4. Birdhouse Fundraiser (wren house)—Lorrie Sonnentag presented a birdhouse made by parishioner, Dan Schmitt who is willing to make 20-30 birdhouses for us to sell at full profit. A discussion was had to determine when and where to sell them (\$12 each or 2 for \$20). It was decided to take orders and see how it goes. It was decided to proceed.
5. Beautification Committee—Jenn Rogalski was wondering about creating a committee or committees for beautification of the church grounds and interior decorating. Carol Pilgrim, Lori McQuillan, Pat Ruff, and Nancy Kowalczyk currently take care of Boyd (Rectory/Church/School). Checking with Dorothy Kaiser or Jim Couey on who takes care of Cadott. Reany McGuire and Mary Fitsimmons plant and weed around Stanley. We had a discussion of desired projects for exterior beautification projects.
 - Do we want to have separate committees for Interior and Exterior beautification projects?
6. Artificial Easter Bouquets for 2026-request from Fr. Felix—Jenn Rogalski is working with Kathy Sedlacek to make up bouquets for future use to replace the lilies as they die out during the long Easter season. Examples of bouquets will be made up and prices for each to determine a budget.
7. Stainless steel wire shelving for Boyd-Jenn Rogalski would like to make similar set ups in all 3 churches to make it consistent for workers to find items being used for funeral services. She would like to get stainless steel rolling racks for each location. Stanley has them and she'd like to add some to Boyd next. They are about \$225 each. Nancy Kowalczyk made a motion to allow up to \$500 to purchase 2 shelving units for Boyd. Seconded by Mary Cole. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Shirt Conversation: Tabled this conversation for later. Researching prices and approved logo to determine if ASPCCW would like matching shirts to wear at events to be recognizable as members and volunteers working at various events.

9. Nomination Committee needs to be formed since terms are coming to an end and we are looking forward to elections. These committee members cannot be on the current executive board or appointed to the board. Looking for volunteers to form this committee.

10. Other: Theresa Sedlacek is Fr. Felix's housekeeper and Father requested a good spring cleaning of the rectory on a day when Theresa is doing her regular cleaning. A few volunteers were added to a list and will be contacted to do a full detailed cleaning when the opportunity arises.
