+ Fourth Sunday of Easter

This past week we have been reading the sixth chapter of John's gospel during weekday Masses. The chapter is Jesus' explicit teaching on the Mass and Holy Eucharist, sometimes called the Bread of Life Discourse. For those of you who are familiar with the prayer app Hallow, you likely know Jeff Cavins who gives daily biblical reflections on the readings at Mass. This week he revealed that he was baptized and raised Catholic, but later on in life left the Catholic Church and became an evangelical protestant pastor. During his studies to be an evangelical pastor, the sixth chapter of John was always explained away as a metaphor, or an analogy, Jesus used referring to the bread and wine as his true flesh and blood, that he didn't mean it literally. Jeff would often get into heated discussions with his dad, who remained a faithful Catholic, about what Jesus meant. Once again, it came down to who's interpretation was right.

As Jeff pressed further to understand this chapter, he happened to research how the early Church fathers interpreted John 6. The early Church fathers were those who immediately followed the apostles, and some who were directly taught by them. They lived between the first and eighth centuries after Christ. They included such men as Clement of Rome, Ignatius of Antioch, Justin Martyr, Origin, and Augustine. Guess what? None of them referred to the bread and wine as some analogy. Every one of them believed and taught that the consecrated bread and wine of the Holy Eucharist is Jesus true body, blood, soul, and divinity. The understanding of the sixth chapter of John as some kind of analogy, and not Jesus' true body and blood, did not happen until the 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> centuries during the reformation. So how could the Church have believed in the true presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist for 1500 years, and then suddenly discover it was not?

Once Jeff discovered this, he also had to admit that personal interpretation of the bible can be dangerous. He came to realize that he needed to submit and believe in the apostolic Church that interpreted this chapter, and not a personal interpretation. Once he came to that conclusion, he made his return to his roots, to the Holy Eucharist, and to the Catholic Church. The next order of business was to meet with his father and tell him, "You were right all along!"

This Sunday we celebrate the First Holy Communion of our second graders at the 10:30 Mass in Boyd. May their faith remind us of the precious gift of the Holy Eucharist in our lives, and never take it for granted. "O Jesus, for thee I live; O Jesus, for thee I die; O Jesus, I am yours in life and in death. O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving, be every moment thine!"

**Fourth Sunday of Easter**

Today’s readings on this fourth Sunday of Easter offer us a glimpse into the heart of our loving Savior. He is the Good Shepherd, and we can trust Him confidently as we embrace the stewardship way of life.

This endearing image of Jesus as our shepherd and His personal love for each of us is described in our Gospel passage from John through Jesus’ own words. Here, we see Jesus’ description of Himself as the “Good Shepherd”. He says, “The sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they recognize his voice”.

This image of Jesus as our shepherd inspires us to fulfill our stewardship by giving of our time, talent, and treasure as a sincere expression of gratitude for His love and guidance.

Embracing this lifestyle requires trust on our part. But Christ has shown Himself worthy of our trust. He “bore our sins in His body”. 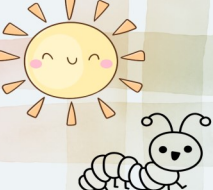

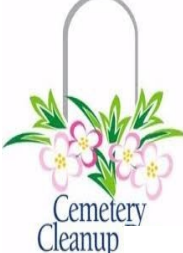
