

All Saints PCCW Minutes

Thursday March 19th, 6:30pm Boyd

Opening Prayer: Prayer to Our Lady of Good Counsel—Jean

Meeting called to order at 6:30pm

Pastor's Message: Prayers for Fr. Felix to make a safe return from his trip.

Old Business:

1. Treasure Report: Ann Wagner (unable to attend, provided financial report):
Previous balance was \$21,981.81/current balance is \$7,468.49
Dec-Mar expenses were \$26,237.31 and income (mostly from funerals & 1 Christmas party) was \$11,724.00
2. Prayer Chain Update: Jean Felber, Melissa Cochran, and Lou Ann Willkom teamed up to update how the prayer chain is organized. They started with Flocknote (contact information gathered during the development of the parish directory) and the existing prayer chain members. They currently have approximately 36 members on Flocknote and 6-8 people that get phone calls from prayer requests. They have a QR code in the bulletin and an image on the parish website for prayer requests and to join the prayer chain. It is expected to grow as more people become aware of it.
3. Funeral luncheon wrap up for 2025: There were 17 funeral luncheons between the 3 churches with an income of \$2,750.00 and the PCCW served 3 events in 2025 bringing in \$900
4. BINGO wrap up for Sept – Dec: The PCCW received \$3,750 for our portion of the Tuesday night BINGO income.
5. Steubenville Scholarships update—There are 4 students and 1 chaperone from our parish so far. They will be doing a “Made from the Heart” raffle (3 quilts, an afghan, a ceramic planter, and a quilted tote bag) after Easter and drawing the winners on June 7th. The students will be expected to sell the tickets to help pay for their way to the conference. The PCCW has money set aside for any remaining expenses for them to attend.
6. Artificial flowers: We are working on some funeral table centerpieces for each church. Looking to do Spring/summer, Fall and Winter (3 seasonal arrangements). If anyone has any nice artificial flowers or dry flower foam to donate, please contact Jen Rogalski. Items can be brought to Tuesday Bingo. When there is enough, we'll set up some flower arranging days.

New Business:

1. Easter Egg Hunt: Palm Sunday after 10:30 Mass in Boyd. Jen Rogalski would like help filling plastic eggs on Friday, March 27th and help hiding eggs during Sunday Mass. The egg hunt will take place in the school if the weather does not cooperate. Easter Bunny will make an appearance as well. If anyone has plastic eggs or Easter baskets or candy/treats to fill the eggs, please get them to Jen.
2. Need nominations for board members: We hope to have vote prior to May meeting so the new team can be announced. Julie Lingen offered to create a nomination form to put in the churches and gather nominations. Those nominated will be contacted to confirm if they are willing to be on the ballot.
3. Ruby's Pantry: Donna Keck presented a little information on Ruby's Pantry. An application has been submitted to have Ruby's Pantry (a box of food from Feed My People given to anyone who comes, for a volunteer donation of \$25) in Stanley. There would be a need for 12 volunteers once a month to work the distribution.
4. There are 17 tabletops that need replacement at St Joseph church basement. They cost \$80 per top. Travis Schuebel would take care of ordering, installing etc. He was just looking for someone to pay for them. $17 \times \$80 = \$1,360$. Marilyn Bowe made a motion to cover the cost, seconded by Anita Boos. The motion passed unanimously.
5. Donation of plastic bowls: We are looking for containers (Cool Whip, sour cream, cottage cheese, or Ice Cream pails). It is nice when they stack together nicely to save space but will make anything work. We have found a need for them after funerals when there is not a caterer. The families can transport leftover food or give away leftovers when there are containers available that don't need to be returned.
6. Spring cleaning at churches: There was a brief discussion of a need to do "spring cleaning" at all the church locations. It was suggested to get the younger families or the students that are looking for volunteer opportunities to be involved. It was suggested to pick a date, give a 1-month notice, and possibly feed those that help. It was also suggested to have one cleaning day for each location.
