From the Desk

The Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord

We're near the end of the Easter season now, concluding next Sunday with the Solemnity of Pentecost, fulfilling the promise of our Lord to send the Holy Spirit. The Easter season is, to say the least, a time of celebration. In our own parish, we've celebrated; First Holy Communion, Confirmation, and a number of infant baptisms. We also celebrated the reception of adults into full communion with the Church at the Easter Vigil Mass. These sacramental celebrations are a wonderful witness to the spiritual life and vitality that is present in our parish family, and the sacraments as basic elements of our faith, and in the life of the Church.

A few days ago I mentioned one of the often repeated themes of Pope St. John Paul II during his papacy, called "the new evangelization". Throughout those years, he was calling for a renewed effort to proclaim the Gospel, particularly in traditional Christian areas that were becoming more and more secularized, suffering from a kind of "fallen away" faith. And what really came out of this message was the need for re-conversion of the already baptized. It was, in essence, a very personal message to all who claim to be disciples of Christ, the already Christian. So how does one engage in this re-evangelization process? Well, for many by "stepping up to the plate", through worship, prayer, and the gift of oneself to others. But for some, it may begin by opening or re-opening the portals of grace given to us by Jesus Christ himself through the sacraments. You know, among the seven sacraments of the Church there are three that are called sacraments of initiation; baptism, 1<sup>st</sup> Holy Communion, and Confirmation. It is these three that initially bring us into what is called "full communion" with the Church, equipping us for life in the Spirit. For some adults, this can mean completing sacraments that for some reason or another, were never received. It may also mean, sacramentalizing a civil marriage. This is an increasingly common issue, as the "sacramental IQ" of our culture, and even among the faithful, has decreased. Our bishop does not ordinarily give permission for a wedding to be held in a place other than a church. The reason for this is that the Church recognizes marriage as something much more than a legal exchange or civil agreement. As a sacrament, an action of the Holy Trinity and covenant act, it is an exchange of persons. The vows are received by the Church, represented by the priest or deacon, before the Sacramental presence of our Lord. And the beautiful nuptial blessing for the couple at the end of the ceremony reminds us that God blessed the marriage between a man and a woman from the time of Adam and Eve, and continues to do so. I urge you, as we approach Pentecost Sunday, to consider now, what the coming of the Holy Spirit means for you. Consider also, these often used expressions of Pope St. John Paul II; "duc in Altum" (go out into the deep and lower your nets for a catch), and "be not afraid"! Finally, if you have questions about your own situation or that of a loved one, to please contact Father or myself. Knowledge is power, and we are not here to place unnecessary burdens upon you. We were sent to open doors, portals of grace, in order that you may enjoy the Christian life in its fullness.

In Christ, alleluia!
