New State Council Officers: At the state convention five new officers were elected for the next fraternal year, State Deputy is Ross Larson from Marathon, State Secretary is Ernest Reinhart, State Treasurer is Dr. David Kreutz, State Advocate is James Voster, and State Warden is Justin Knapp.

KC Cor Program: At the State convention the big push was for council to get involved with the Cor program instituted by Supreme Council a few years ago. Cor consists of three key elements which must be present for every gathering: Prayer, Formation, and Fraternity. The word ‘cor’ is Latin for heart and the root of the word courage. Prayer, formation, and fraternity all begin with the heart and direct the heart in relationship to God and each other. These three elements build and strengthen each other and help provide consistency and simplicity. Cor exists to refocus Catholic men on Jesus Christ and to form and strengthen them in faith and virtue through a brotherhood committed to prayer, formation, and fraternity. The goal of each Cor gathering is to provide the opportunity for men to encounter Christ, to pray together, to be formed in their faith, and to strengthen their bonds of brotherhood, preparing them for courageous leadership and the mission of evangelization for their families and communities. The Supreme hope for Cor are:1) Offer every Catholic man in the parish with ongoing opportunities to encounter Jesus Christ, grow in his faith, strengthen his prayer life, and transform his friendships. 2) Begin building a fraternal culture of faith, prayer, accompaniment and accountability. 3) Strengthen brotherhood where men are comfortable and willing to sharpen and accompany each other in the pursuit of holiness. 4) Consistently and frequently bring men together to center their lives and friendships on Christ through intentional times of prayer and formation. 5) Provide a foundation of continued evangelization and discipleship for the parish and community. The council is asking if any member who believes this is needed in All Saint Parish, please volunteer to chair this program. It would be a great time for wife and member to work together to lead parish members to strengthen their faith. Contact Grand Knight.

+ Pentecost Sunday

Memorial Day weekend is considered by most people as the beginning of summer. It is a welcome time as we worked our way through a lingering winter with not much spring. In some ways, the time from Memorial Day to Labor Day can end up being an exhausting, rather than a regenerative time, trying to pack too much into too few months. There are two of the Ten Commandments that often get trampled in summer: Keep Holy the Lord's Day and Honor Your Father and Mother. In many respects, both go hand in hand. Consecrate Sunday with your attendance at Holy Mass and then make the rest of the day Family Day. The first is time spent with your family of faith, the second with your family of origin. Interests and activities should not isolate one from another, but foster the bonds of love and friendship.

The last parish bingo took place last Tuesday until we begin again after Labor Day. It was a tense time as the jackpot of nearly \$3,000 was on the line needing a bingo in 56 calls. When the number was called on the 56<sup>th</sup> time, no one yelled "bingo." The jackpot would remain until beginning again in the fall. When the 57<sup>th</sup> number was called, "bingo," was heard with a deep sigh of missing the big jackpot by just one call. What a dramatic end. I want to thank our Knights of Columbus and PCCW for all their dedication and hard work throughout the year. I also want to thank so many of our loyal participants for their support.

Finally, this summer should be a special time as we celebrate our 250<sup>th</sup> birthday as a nation. I remember our bicentennial in 1976. Despite the national conflicts and divisions of that time, we came together as a nation for a wonderful, unifying celebration, both locally and nationally. I don't feel that this year. I said to someone recently that trying to celebrate our 250<sup>th</sup> this time is like a family trying to celebrate their grandparent's 75<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary in the midst of a divorce of one of their children. In light of the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the U.S. bishops will consecrate the United States of America to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Thursday, June 11. To prepare for this occasion, the bishops will have time to hear reflections on the Sacred Heart from several of their brother bishops before the special Mass of consecration, which will be livestreamed on the USCCB's YouTube channel. The bishops' livestream event is intended to be a catalyst to encourage parishes and individuals to participate in the America 250 commemoration by contributing to 250 Hours of Adoration and/or 250 Works of Mercy. The livestream of the public portions of the plenary on June 10 and 11, and the bishops' Mass consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus will be available at www.usccb.org/meetings. Let's join our bishops by praying for and consecrating our nation to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

**Pentecost Sunday**

Throughout our readings today for Pentecost Sunday, we see the powerful truth that the Holy Spirit bestows gifts and guidance in a deeply personal way, inspiring us to live out our faith.

In our first reading from Acts, we hear about the dramatic outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. A strong wind filled the house, and tongues of fire settled on each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, inspiring awe and confidence in the Spirit's power.

Notice how personal this moment is. The Spirit came upon each individual, equipping them uniquely to share the Gospel and reminding us that embracing stewardship means allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us as we use our gifts for our shared mission.

In our Gospel, Jesus sends His disciples forth: “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” This is our mission as well. Yet we are not sent alone. Jesus gives us His peace — “Peace be with you.”

As this Easter season draws to a close, let us be at peace and resolve to rely more fully on the Holy Spirit as our guide in the stewardship way of life.
