+ Sixteenth Sunday In Ordinary Time

Much has been going on this past week in the 700 block of East Patten St.! As we come into this weekend the infrastructure of the street was completed replacing all of the water, storm, and sanitary pipes. Loads of material were brought in to prepare the final surface repair of the street.

The five cedar trees on the northwest section of the rectory property were removed in just a few days. The contractor did a superb job of cleanup, and even reseeded the lawn in areas where the stumps were removed. You would hardly believe those giant trees were once there. This opens up space for the maple trees and the one younger cedar tree still on the property. I can't believe how much more light comes into the rectory. This will be especially appreciated in the winter months.

The old steps in the church were completely removed and all of the debris hauled away. The hole is being prepared for the foundation of the new addition and the elevator shaft. We had our first construction meeting report this past week and were told that pouring of the foundation and elevator shaft may begin as soon as next week.

Some good news and some bad. The good news first. Removing the interior covering on the basement wall revealed an opening going into the area underneath the steps. I think I told you that already. Having removed the exterior steps shows an opening large enough to serve as the actual entrance to the basement as we planned. This means that the contractors will not have to cut into the foundation wall of the church and put any risk to our 100-year-old building! It will only have to be enlarged a bit. The miracle...it is exactly in the place the architects planned on putting the doorway in the first place.

The bad news is that we discovered a water problem on the east wall of the interior part of the church between the confessional and the lower window. This is right where the two roofs come together. Looking at the problem there seems to be an issue with both the gutters and missing concrete between the bricks. I had our company who did the interior renovations here to look at the issue, and once the problem gets fixed, they will need to come in and redo the corner section between the window and the confessional. That was not in the plan, but it needs to be redone before we reopen at Christmas. I will let you know what this will cost and may need to make an appeal for this work. There is always something, isn't there. Despite it all, things are progressing very well. Always include the safety of the workers in your prayers.

Source—Stewardship Reflections by Catholic Stewardship  
— July 19, 2026 —  
Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel from Matthew presents parables that highlight the importance of stewardship, reminding us how our role in building the Kingdom is both challenging and encouraging.

First, He compares the Kingdom to a field where both wheat and weeds grow together until the harvest. Only then are they separated — the wheat gathered into the Sower's barn and the weeds destroyed. It is a sobering reminder that our choices matter and that God, in His justice, will one day call each of us to account for how we have lived and used the gifts He has entrusted to us.

But Jesus also offers great encouragement. He compares the Kingdom to a mustard seed, the smallest of seeds, which grows into a large plant. He also compares it to a small amount of yeast that quietly transforms an entire batch of dough.

These images are especially consoling for Christian stewards. So often, the prayers we pray, the service we offer, and the gifts we share can seem small compared to the needs around us. Yet Jesus reminds us that God works powerfully through even the smallest acts of faithfulness, encouraging us to trust that our efforts matter.

God sees and treasures our offerings of time, talent, and treasure. When placed in His hands, they can bear far more fruit than we could ever imagine, reminding us that His power transforms our small contributions into great blessings.

In gratitude for all He has given us, let us stay committed to our stewardship and faithfully continue building His Kingdom every day.
