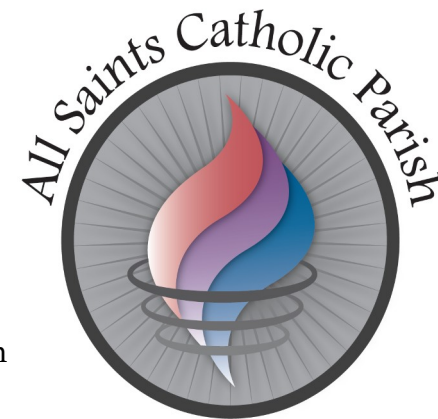

# God’s Creation

## A Gift of His Love

Sacred Scripture begins with the words, “In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth” (Genesis 1:1). For all eternity God had a “plan of loving goodness” and creation is the foundation of His plan. The story of creation answers the deepest questions of life. These words from Scripture reveal that God alone is Creator and He sustains all things. Every part of creation, from the smallest seed to the most distant star, reflects God’s goodness and wisdom.

The act of creation is an expression of God’s overflowing love. He called all things into existence from nothing: the vastness of the sky, the beauty of the land, the rhythm of the sea, the light of the sun and the moon, and the human person.

The first words from Scripture also reveal who we are in God’s plan. As the crown of His creation, God formed man and woman in His image and likeness. In His infinite, generous love, God desired to share His life and goodness with human persons, who could freely respond to Him in love.

We have a unique dignity; God wants us to know Him and invites us to share in the life of the Blessed Trinity. In the whole of visible creation, only man and woman were created for union

with God. This is the purpose of our lives and the reason why God created each and every one of us.

Being created in God’s image means that each person has an immortal soul, with the powers of intellect – our capacity to think – and will – our capacity to choose good over evil. We can know the truth, and we can freely choose the good. God gives us freedom because love must be freely given. He never forces us, but gently calls us to Himself, inviting you and I to share in His divine life.

Creation is not just something God did long ago. The same divine love that spoke the world into being continues to hold it in existence. God sustains us and guides all of creation toward perfection by Divine Providence. Every breath we take is a gift. Every sunrise, every newborn child, every friendship: all of it flows from the Creator’s hand.

As disciples of Christ, we are called to see the world with new eyes, to recognize in all things the presence of God’s love. To live as good stewards of creation means to respect life, to live with gratitude and to care for the earth. When we see creation as a gift, not a possession, we naturally respond with praise. The beauty of the created world draws us toward worship of its Maker – our Heavenly Father.

Through Jesus Christ, creation is renewed and redeemed. In Him, the harmony that sin disrupted is restored through His grace. Christ reveals the full dignity of the human person and invites all creation to share in the glory of God.

There is a connection between our pondering the gift of God’s creation and our lives of faith, hope and love. “The more we know about God’s loving work of creation the more we can believe and trust Him. With the eyes of *faith*, we see Him at work everywhere and in everything. With this knowledge we are not afraid and can give reasons for the *hope* that is in us. *Love* is the only response we want to make toward the Lord. Jesus came to show us how to love sacrificially and gives us the grace to do so. Loving Him here and loving our neighbor prepares us for the life and love in Heaven” (*Echoing the Mystery*, 126, Barbara Morgan).

May we pause this week to see the beauty of God’s work. Let us give thanks for the gift of creation and for the Creator, our Heavenly Father, who guards and protects us, His beloved son and daughters. May our lives reflect His goodness so that, in all we do, we may proclaim with joy: “Bless the Lord; all you works of the Lord; sing praise to Him and highly exalt Him forever.” (*Daniel 3:57*)

Over the last fifty years of my life I have had the privilege and joy of travelling to many places in the world. My favorite subject when I was in grade school was geography. I loved to study the many different cultures and places on our planet: the customs, the history, the traditions, the food, the language and the people. I have been to many places in North, Central, and South America. I have traveled to most of the western European countries, and explored the Middle East and Africa.

Throughout all of my travels, a few things hold true for me. First, I have never been to a place where there has not been discontent over their respective nation's government and leaders. There always seemed to be strife and conflict, no matter where I went. Secondly, wonder and magnificence of any culture was not in its politics, but in its ordinary people. The more I got to know ordinary people on an individual and personal basis, the more I learned about the true beauty and culture of the place. Most people remember the author, Mark Twain, by his stories of Tom Sawyer and Huck Finn and their explorations down the Mississippi. I loved those stories as a young boy. Mark Twain was himself a world traveler and wrote many newspaper articles and books about his discoveries. It was because of these experiences that Mark Twain said, "Travel is fatal to prejudice, bigotry, and narrow-mindedness, and many of our people need it sorely on these accounts."

As I observed in my homily last weekend, so many of the tens of thousands of foreigners attending the World Cup games remarked how different they found the United States of America, unlike the picture that was painted for them by their mainstream media before they came. I think this shows the power of media today and how it is such a tool for the devil. If the international visitors realized how deceived they were, perhaps we should take note and not only how we are led to see them, but each other. Perhaps we should turn off the 24-hour news channels and tune in to National Geographic, Discovery, the History Channel and travel shows.

As we celebrate our 250<sup>th</sup> birthday as a nation this weekend, we should not be shy about being a proud nation. Please remember that Europeans have furniture older than our country. We are still a young nation in comparison, less than three generations of 100 year olds. But perhaps when we look at all that has been accomplished for the good in just 250 years, not only of our own country, but the world, that is a miracle.

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The theme of humility is central to our readings today. God Himself, in His humility, shows us the way. Recognizing His humility can inspire us to emulate His example, making us feel reverent and motivated to follow Him as Christian stewards. In fact, humility is key to the stewardship way of life and to a peaceful and fulfilling life.

In our Gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus Himself speaks to the Father about the privileged role that humble souls play in God’s plan of salvation. “I give praise to you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned, you have revealed them to little ones.”

What does it mean to be a “little one”? It means that we acknowledge we don’t have it all figured out, which can make us feel humble and open. It also reminds us of our deep need for a savior, fostering a sense of dependence on God. It means we recognize that all we are and all we have been given are gifts from God. It means we embrace the stewardship way of life, encouraging humility and trust in divine guidance.

A Catholic Phrase to Understand Better:  
A disciple of Jesus Christ

To His disciples, Jesus reveals the mystery of His Kingdom and gives them a share in His mission, joy, and His sufferings. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, glossary) Jesus wants an intimate communion with His disciples, which He expresses in these words: “Abide in Me, and I in you” (John 15:5). “He who eats My flesh and drinks My Blood abides in Me and I in Him” (John 6:56).

The word disciple relates to the word discipline, specifically regarding a student learning a discipline, which is a process. We are children of God in a life-long learning process. As collaborators, Jesus wants us to learn so we can, by the power of the Holy Spirit, interiorize His teaching and His very Life and become co-laborers to help others encounter Him and become His disciples.
